SANTA'S HELPERS:

In the United States we use dollars, but in Japan they use yen, and in Europe they use euros. Each country's currency has its own look and value, but all of them help people buy and sell things where they live.

This Christmas, there are so many nice kids that Santa's elves can't make all the toys in time! Santa has to send them around the world to buy gifts instead — but that means using different currencies everywhere they go.

Can you help the elves figure out what money they'll need and how much things cost in U.S. dollars (\$)?

Example: How to Solve

Example Question:

In Australia, elves buy toy stuffed koalas for **10 Australian dollars each**.

If 1 Australian dollar = **\$0.65**, how much is one toy in U.S. dollars?

$$\text{Calculator icon} \quad 10 \times 0.65 = \$6.50$$
